Making suggestions

- ⤴ I think we should....
- ⤴ I don't think we should. . .
- ⤴ I'd rather... (do XY) than (Z)
- ⤴ Maybe we could... (do XY)
- ⤴ Why don't we.... (do XY)
- ⤴ Why can't we... (do XY)
- ⤴ Let's... (do XY)
- ⤴ I would suggest (vorschlagen)... (doing XY)
- ⤴ I would recommend (empfehlen)... (doing XY)

Agreeing

- ⤴ I agree.
- ⤴ So do I.
- ⤴ Me too.
- ⤴ That's a good idea.
- ⤴ Good suggestion.
- ⤴ Sounds like a good idea.
- ⤴ I don't like it either. / Me neither. (Ich auch nicht.)
- ⤴ You're right.
- ⤴ That's right.
- ⤴ Good idea.
- ⤴ I think that's a good idea.

Disagreeing

- ⤴ I disagree.
- ⤴ I don't think so.
- ⤴ (No.) That's not right.
- ⤴ Yes, but...
- ⤴ (I'm sorry, but) I don't agree.

Creating an order

- ⤴ First we should...
- ⤴ I would like to start with... (doing XY)
- ⤴ Most important for me is...
- ⤴ On January X, I would like to...
- ⤴ Afterwards we could...
- ⤴ Before ... I need to...

Commenting

Acknowledge what someone has just said before stating your own ideas:

- ⤴ That's interesting. I think that...
- ⤴ Interesting point. I would like to add...
- ⤴ Hmm. I hadn't thought of that before.

Questions can also be a useful way of bringing new ideas into a conversation:

- ⤴ What do you think about . . .
- ⤴ Have you considered . . .
- ⤴ What about . . .

Sometimes a more direct approach is appropriate:

- ⤴ Can I add something here?
- ⤴ (Do you) mind if I interject something here?
- ⤴ Sorry for interrupting but...
